I. Presentation of the organization

The organization was established in 1998 under the name “Initiatives and Civil Activities” Foundation. In the beginning of 2000, organizational and structural changes took place and led to to change in the registration. Regional Fund – IGA (Initiatives and Civil Activities) was established. It still continues to exist up to now and implements its activities under the name Crime Prevention Fund - IGA.

For accomplishing its goals the organization:

- Develops and adopts experimental programmes and models;
- Performs training, consulting, information-educational and publishing activities;
- Improves the dialogue and interinstitutional relations;
- Monitors the institutions engaged with crime problems;
- Carries out advocacy campaigns in favor of the target groups;

- Builds national and international partnerships.

- ☞ 2004 - Fund IGA won the prestigious International award in “Pioneer Organization” Category at the International Conference “Probation” 2004 in London, organized by the National Probation Directorate of England and Wales.

II. More significant results achieved in the period 1999-2012

Probation

- Realizing two training visits in Great Britain and an international conference in Bulgaria for the popularization of probation;
- Establishing the first Probation Centre in the country, training the first 20 probation specialists;
- Developing Concept for Legislative Introduction of Probation in Bulgaria;
- Organizing information-training seminars on probation with more than 1000 participants (judges, prosecutors, investigation judges, police officers, representatives of local authorities and NGOs);
- Presenting the first Independent Report on Monitoring of the Legislative and Institutional Introduction of Probation in Bulgaria;

Work with offenders

- Developing and adopting of a model for delivering of social services to offenders in several regions in the country;
- Establishing Centre for Social Services in Pazardzhik (2005);
- Adapting to the Bulgarian conditions a structured instrument for assessment of the risk and the needs of young offenders on the basis of the British ASSET;
- Creating “Assessment and management of cases” specialization in Plovdiv University “Paisii Hilendarski”;
- Conducting criminal research of the sexual offenders from the country in all prisons;
- Piloting the first programme for work with sexual offenders from 4 prisons in the country;

- Developing a model for social service for people, released from prison. Developing methods of the service and piloting with 200 users;
- Preparing specialized personnel from institutions and NGOs for recognition and mastering of behaviour deviations, prevention and resocialization – about 200 people;
- Delivering of different services to 2121 to adult imprisoned people, including people released from prison, to 758 young offenders, as well as to members of their families;
- Establishing the first Centre for social rehabilitation and integration of offenders in Bulgaria – delegated state activity

Prevention of the dissemination of HIV, tuberculosis, and drug use

- Conducting a defence campaign for the adoption of the second in the country Municipal programme for prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of drug habits in Pazardzhik;

Contents: The project aims at improving the quality of life of the people in Bulgaria by creating a network for improving the social inclusion of adolescents in conflict with the law between Bulgaria and the Netherlands. The innovative model of the network WorkWise will be transferred and adapted in Bulgaria. The model has been formed and developed in the Netherlands within the framework of the programme EQUAL and its focus is on the postinstitutional care of adolescents in conflict with the law. Methods for implementing a system for aftercare of adolescents, who leave institutions for children in conflict with the law, will be developed and adopted. The functioning of the pilot system will be monitored within 6 months. The project will end with the formation of network of relevant institutions and organizations on the model of the network WorkWise.

Project RATES – Risk Assessment, Treatment and Evaluation System

Source of funding: Oak Foundation

Implementation term: October 2012 – October 2016

Contents: The project aims at forming a fully functioning system for treatment and supervision of sexual offenders in Bulgaria, which will reduce recidivism among them.

The project develops in 4 basic directions:

- adapting and applying effective instruments for diagnostics and risk assessment;
- adequate and effective interventions in prisons;
- taking decisions about the sexual offenders' inclusion in society;
- high-quality interventions, based on the community, which provide continuity of the treatment and the supervision of each sexual offender.

Contents: The overall goal of the project is to integrate drop-outs from 3rd to 8th grade into “Vasil Drumev” primary school in Sofia and to identify and motivate them to enroll in daily or individual education.

Project: “Delivery of services and assistance in the sphere of prevention and protection of home abuse in line with article 6, paragraph 7 from the Law for protection of home abuse”

Goals of the project: Delivery of psychological, social, and legal assistance to victims of home abuse and delivery of rehabilitation services to perpetrators of home abuse.

Activities: Training seminar for all specialists from the project and for the representatives of the relevant institutions, which apply the Law for protection of home abuse; Establishing Bureau for consultation and guidance of victims to the Centre for social rehabilitation and integration (CSRI) part of Crime Prevention Fund – IGA, whose goal is to deliver social, psychological, and legal services together with a team of experts from Crisis Centre – Peshtera; Introducing a specialized programme for perpetrators of home abuse, part of the service CSRI, Popularizing the programmes and services under the Law for protection of home abuse within the framework of the programme at the territory of the particular region.

Contents: The project aims at identifying the factors, which influence the sustainability of the probation employees, reporting the different factors in some European countries, identifying promising approaches, which will develop and maintain their sustainability and at the same time will prevent from the negative consequences from the probation in Europe, etc.

Outcome: Methods for assessment of the sustainability of the probation employees will be developed as well as pilot schemes/action plans for prevention from negative consequences for the probation employees.

Project: “Drug abuse and sexual violence II”

Leading organization: Il Pioppo, Italy

Source of funding: European Commission, Programme “Dafni III”

Implementation term: 09.12.2011 – 08.12.2013

Contents: The project aims at improving the condition of female drug addicts, victims of sexual violence. The project indirectly assists vulnerable women, who live in an environment of cultural and social privations or in unhealthy conditions (women from incomplete families, women who are homeless, immigrants, deprived of freedom, prostitutes) and who can use drugs and be exposed to the risk of violence in the future.

Goals of the project:

- Facilitating the access of female drug addicts to social and healthcare services;
- Providing new instruments for consultation and assistance of female drug users, victims of sexual violation or exposed to a risk of violence;
- Encouraging the active participation of teachers from secondary schools and school of higher education, youth leaders and animators, pedagogues and social workers, for the application of informative and preventive activities minimizing drug use, which is a prerequisite for sexual violations.

Project “ISDEP – Improving security by democratic participation”

Leading organization: Association of the senior police officers of England, Wales, and Northern Ireland

Implementation term: 11.12.2012 – 10.12.2014

Contents: The project focuses on improving the interior security by active democratic participation not by passive security. The project is based on the necessity to make our societies in EU adaptive to changes by stimulating openness to changes and diversity through a multilateral and multistage approach.

State delegated activities

1. Crisis Centre for people and children, victims of violence (CCPCVV) – Peshtera

State delegated activity assigned for implementation by Peshtera Municipality and opened by Order № ПД 01–331 от 25.03.2009 of State Agency “Social Assistance”.

Target group: Children and families at risk as well as their families/relatives. The service is aimed particularly at: children, victims of violence; children at risk of committing offences; children registered at the Local commissions against antisocial acts of juveniles and minors or at the school LCAAJM; children registered at the Children pedagogic rooms at the District Police Departments; people, victims of violence; people, victims of trafficking; families/mentors/relatives of the above-mentioned groups.

2. Centre for Social Rehabilitation and Integration of Children from Risk Groups

State delegated activity assigned for implementation by Plovdiv Municipality to Crime Prevention Fund – IGA with a contract for social services № 09ДГ690/24.04.2009 and Annex № 1/30.03.2012.

Target group: Children with behaviour problems, who are at risk of committing offences; children with behaviour deviations, who are on account of Children pedagogic rooms (CPR); children, who have committed offences and who comply with measures assigned by the Local Commission against antisocial acts of juveniles and minors (LCAAJM); children, who are accommodated in or who leave specialized schools such as Social-Pedagogic Boarding School and Correctional Boarding school; children sentences to probation; children directed by School Commission against Antisocial acts of juveniles and minors (SCAAJM); children, who are at the risk of committing offences, directed by Department for Child Protection.

3. Centre for Social Rehabilitation and Integration with support for children to develop skills for an independent life and prevention from risky behaviour – Plovdiv

State delegated activity assigned for implementation by Plovdiv Municipality to Crime Prevention Fund – IGA with a contract for social services № 11ДГ657/10.06.2011.

Target groups: Children and adolescents from Homes for Children Deprived of Parental Care (HCDPC); adolescents who leave the specialized institutions for children; children at risk from dropping out of school; children who have dropped out of school and children beyond the scope of the educational system; families of the above-mentioned groups.

4. Monitored Care Unit

State delegated activity assigned for implementation by Plovdiv Municipality to Fund – IGA with a contract for social services № 11ДГ655/10.06.2011.

Monitored Care Unit is a kind of social service for assisting and consulting young adults, who leave a specialized institution and who have to start an independent life.

5. Centre for family accommodation – Pavelsko, Chepelare Municipality

Social resident service, which provides healthy environment for a full growing and development of children deprived of parental care. At the moment of the accommodation there is no possibility for them to go back to their biological family or to be accommodated at the house of their relatives/acquaintances or a foster family. The implementation of the service is assigned to Crime Prevention Fund – IGA in May 2012.

Target groups: Children from 3 to 18, who are deprived of parental care; children from 3 to 18 who are at risk and who cannot go back to their biological family and cannot be accommodated at the house of their relatives/acquaintances or a foster family; children who are about to leave a specialized institution or to finish their education.

6. Centre for Social Rehabilitation and Integration of Offenders

The Centre has been functioning since 01.07.2012 as a state delegated activity to Pazardzhik Municipality and the implementation of the service has been assigned to Crime Prevention Fund – IGA since 01.09.2012.

Target groups: People released from prisons; people on conditional release; people with “Probation” punishment.

7. Urgent Reception Centre

The Urgent Reception Centre is part of the Centre for Public Assistance. It delivers services to children from 3 to 18, who are in a crisis situation. This crisis situation can be related to the satisfaction of their needs or to the creation of conditions for overcoming the trauma and successfully reintegrating into their biological family and the community. If it is not possible for the child to go back to their biological family, they will be prepared for the accommodation at a place outside the family environment.

The Centre functioned from 01.08 to 31.12.2012 as a state delegated activity, which was implemented within the framework of Complex for Social Services for Children and Families (CSSCF) from Konsortium from NGO including Fund - IGA.

8. “Mother and Baby” Unit

“Mother and Baby” Unit gives mothers the opportunity to adapt and to get attached to their children. In this way there are no conditions for the child’s accommodation at a specialized institution. Besides, situations that threaten the child’s security and development are prevented.

Target groups: A mother with her child, who is at risk of being accommodated at a specialized institution (single mothers, minors, mothers in a difficult social condition, a mother and a child, victims of violence), pregnant mothers in the last month of their pregnancy, who are at the risk of leaving the child after the birth (pregnant minors, who are not ready to be mothers, pregnant women in a very difficult material, residential, financial, or family condition). The Centre functioned from 01.08 to 31.12.2012 as a state delegated activity, which was implemented within the framework of CSSCF from Konsortium from NGO including Fund – IGA.

IV. Social Services Centre of Fund – IGA

(It has been functioning since 31.08.2012; the service has been delivered within the framework of CSRI for offenders as a state delegated activity since 01.09.2012)

The Social Services Centre is a psycho-social office, which delivers specialized services and care for the prevention of behaviour problems and offences among minors, juveniles, and adults; rehabilitation and integration of marginalized groups in active cooperation between the clients and the different social systems; it also deals with life crisis, psychological problems and tries to make the life of the people and families satisfying.

The following services have been delivered:

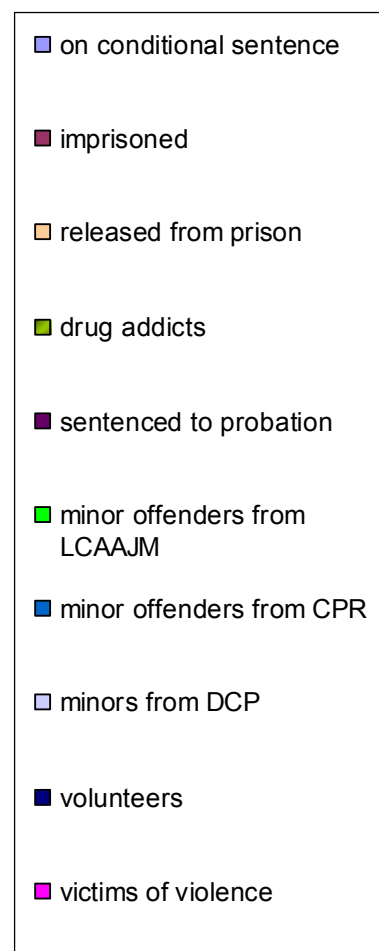
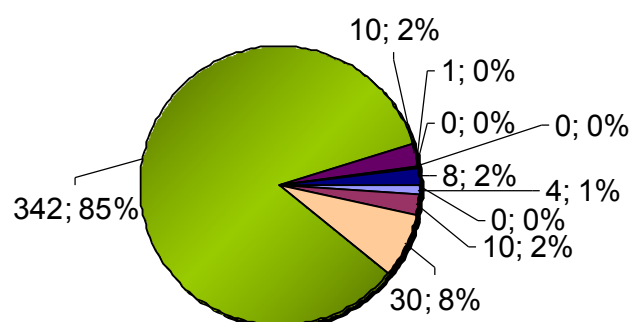
1. Family consultations
2. Social consultations, assistance and mediation in solving problems related to personal documents, residential problems, problems between the client and a particular institution or organization, health problems, and problems related to drug use.

3. Programmes for psycho-social assistance, professional orientation and training Programmes.

4. Individual psychological consultations for children and people, victims of violence.

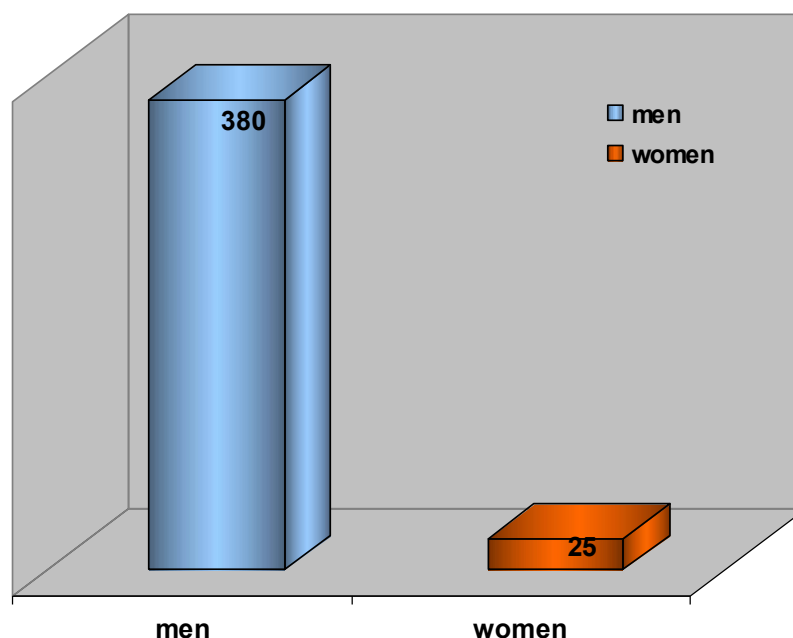

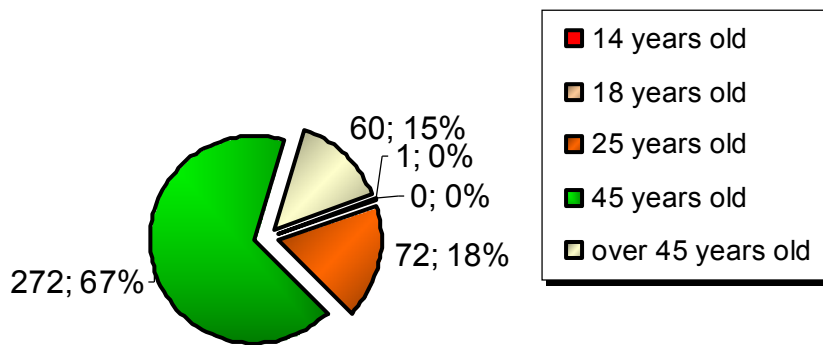

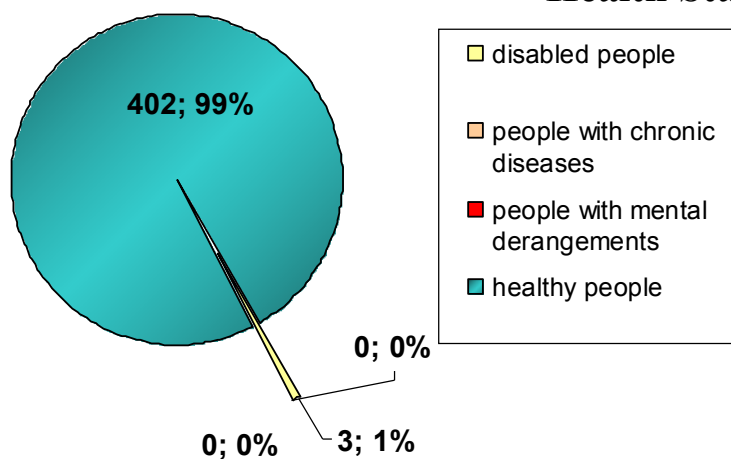
